

Idaho AgCredit Code of Ethics

Idaho AgCredit is committed to conducting business in compliance with all applicable laws and regulations while maintaining high standards of business ethics. As such, all Idaho AgCredit directors and employees must do the following:

- Maintain high ethical standards, including high standards of care, honesty, integrity, and fairness, and exercise diligence and good business judgment in carrying out official duties.
- Act in the best interest of Idaho AgCredit, and preserve the reputation of and the public's confidence in both Idaho AgCredit and the Farm Credit System.
- Comply with Idaho AgCredit's Standards of Conduct and Code of Ethics, along with all applicable laws and regulations.
- Avoid self-dealing and acceptance of gifts or favors that may be intended, or have the appearance of being intended, to influence official actions or decisions.
- Protect the confidentiality of non-public information obtained or created in the course of business and prevent the unauthorized disclosure of this information unless required by law or regulation.
- Produce full, fair, accurate, timely and understandable disclosures in AgCredit financial statements and related financial reports or communications, as well as AgCredit reports and documents filed with, or submitted to, CoBank, the Funding Corporation, and/or the Farm Credit Administration.
- Report to the Standards of Conduct Official conflicts of interest and circumstances or transactions that have the appearance of creating a conflict of interest involving themselves, their family, or their reportable business entities.
- Work with the Standards of Conduct Official to identify and resolve reported actual or apparent conflicts of interest.
- Timely report to the Standards of Conduct Official or Idaho AgCredit's anonymous reporting service any known or suspected illegal or unethical activity, or violation of Idaho AgCredit's Standards of Conduct and Code of Ethics.
- Idaho AgCredit's officers and directors must fulfill their fiduciary duties to Idaho AgCredit and its stockholders.
